Marine receives scholarship to pursue a career in education

"I've always been a history buff, and I want to teach students the history of this country from the perspective of the men who have defended it," said Matthew Zifcheck, 30, of Columbia Station, Ohio.

Zifcheck served in the Marine Corps for 4 years, working in infantry in Iraq. Now he's hoping to take the skills he learned in battle and apply them to the classroom.
